

PARTICIPATING IN THE ENERGY WORKING GROUP - Feb 2023

The Energy Working Group is involved in a range of topics related to sources for electricity generation in Thailand, transmission, and distribution.

Contributing to Thailand's journey away from fossil fuels is thus in the group's scope. The transition from sources with high Greenhouse Gas footprints to those with lower footprints (e.g. LNG) to 'new' renewables is a core part of the group's interests, and doing so in ways which recognise energy security.

Helping to promote those businesses which contribute to the larger national vision is in our mission. Sustainability integration is an education process and one which needs awareness of benefits and sources of support.

Objectives of the Energy Working Group

- 1) To be a forum for issues of interest to EABC members on issues related to Energy
- 2) To be a thought leader and producer of attractive and value-adding solutions on Energy; builder of consensus in the European business community and more widely.
- 3) To bring an understanding of relevant EU policies, laws and regulation and world best practice options for resolution of issues and problems.
- 4) To promote renewables and their business efficacy.
- 5) To provide a networking and business connection in Energy industries for EABC members

Meetings – internal; External engagement

- The Energy Working Group addresses issues as needed and meets to examine, probes and build consensus on Energy topics.
- The Energy Working Group meets formally once per quarter, more frequently on specific topics, and holds small group meetings and other modes of engagement with government agencies and industry bodies.
- The Working Group meets with relevant agencies and industry bodies.
